## **2024: WHAT'S NEW IN FRANCE?**

With a number of new and exciting openings, exhibitions, sustainable tourism initiatives, major anniversaries (including Impressionism and D-Day) and the Paris 2024 Summer Olympic & Paralympic Games, it is without doubt that 2024 is the year to travel to France! Read on to find out more about the exciting new things coming to France next year.

France continues to experience a surge in tourism levels since Covid-19. Cumulative international tourism receipts to the end of August 2023 stood at €44.3 billion, up 13% on 2019 (source: Banque de France). The UK remains in the top three outbound markets for France. Forecasts for international air arrivals in the final quarter of 2023 are positive, indicating an increase in European customers, particularly Spanish (+20%), British (+18%) and Austrian (+20%).

The 2023 Rugby World Cup (8 September – 28 October) saw international arrivals of nationalities with participating teams rise sharply on 2019 (+19% on 2022). The tournament was responsible for 600,000 foreign visitors to France, representing 45% of ticket buyers from 115 countries, including around 45% English and around 8% Irish visitors. With the Summer Olympic & Paralympic Games taking place in Paris and other French destinations in 2024, it is set to be a promising year for France, with a surge in visitor numbers expected versus 2019.



THE PRIX DE L'ENTENTE LITTÉRAIRE A NEW ANNUAL BOOK PRIZE Across France 21 September 2023

Queen Camilla and the French President's wife Brigitte Macron have launched a <u>UK-France literary prize</u> for young adult fiction, which will allow "UK and French citizens to share joint literary experiences, reinforcing cultural ties while celebrating the joys of reading", Buckingham Palace said in a statement. The prize is inspired by the Entente Cordiale, the 1904 agreement between the UK and French governments that significantly improved bilateral relations. The launch ceremony was held at the French National Library (BnF) in central Paris, which reopened in 2022 after 12 years of renovations.

TWO NEW UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITES Maison Carrée (Nîmes) and Martinique's Pitons and Mount Pelée 19 September 2023

Two French sites have been newly added to the UNESCO World Heritage List. At a World Heritage Committee meeting in September, it was decided unanimously that the Maison Carrée in Nîmes, a Roman temple built in the 1st century AD, should become the 51st French site entered on the prestigious list. The site reopened in 2022 following renovation. The volcanic, forested area of Mount Pelée and the Pitons du Carbet in northern Martinique has also been added to the list, bringing the total number of UNESCO sites in France to 52. and reveal a backstage peek inside a glassmaker's workshop. OPENING OF CITÉ INTERNATIONALE DE LA LANGUE FRANÇAISE Villers-Cotterêts, Hauts-de-France 19 October 2023

The much-anticipated <u>Cité Internationale de la Langue Française</u> is a cultural leisure site dedicated entirely to the French language and the French-speaking world. The site is a multidisciplinary institute and has been made accessible to all, bringing together varied and complementary activities including a visitor route, temporary exhibitions, one-off performances and residency workshops for artists. It is housed within the Château de Villers-Cotterêts, a member of France's Centre des Monuments Nationaux.

#### OPENING OF MAISON GAINSBOURG Paris Île-de-France 20 September 2023

Serge Gainsbourg's legendary house at 5 bis rue de Verneuil is accompanied across the street by a museum, a book and gift shop, and Le Gainsbarre, a café and piano-bar. Together they form Maison Gainsbourg, the first cultural institution dedicated to the French singersongwriter. Tours of the house are narrated by Charlotte Gainsbourg, Serge's daughter. The museum displays almost 450 original objects: manuscripts, artworks, jewellery and clothes, plus a selection of rare and sometimes unpublished television, film, radio and photographic archives.

REOPENING OF THE SAINT HUBERT CHAPEL AT THE ROYAL CHÂTEAU OF AMBOISE Amboise, Centre-Val de Loire End 2023

After just over two and a half years of work involving craftsmen from a dozen different trades, the <u>Saint Hubert Chapel</u> will be fully reopened to visitors to the Royal Château of Amboise at the end of 2023. This architectural jewel, built by the kings of France during the Renaissance and which houses the tomb of Leonardo da Vinci, has undergone a major restoration: the sculpted stone decorations, lead ornaments, roof, frame and stained glass windows have all been given a new lease of life.



#### ESCALE À SÈTE: FESTIVAL OF MARITIME TRADITIONS Sète, Occitanie 26 March – 1 April 2024

Comprising music and sea shanties, costumed parades and tours of traditional boats, this biennial festival is the largest celebration of maritime traditions in the south of France and attracts 250,000 visitors to Sète every two years. Over 100 boats are welcomed to the town's harbour for the celebration, from France and across the world. Sète is a Mediterranean seaport that was founded under Louis XIV, sitting today at the crossroads of the Canal du Midi, Canal du Rhône and Gulf of Lion.

#### 20TH INTERNATIONAL QUAIS DU POLAR CRIME FICTION FESTIVAL Lyon, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 5-7 April 2024

RECENTLY ADDED

In 2024, Quais du Polar will be celebrating its 20th birthday under the theme of '20 Years of noir'. This anniversary edition will reflect on two decades of a genre that has continuously evolved and reinvented itself, authors welcoming hundreds of from backgrounds. It's been two decades of engaging, inspiring and occasionally moving encounters, with thousands of passionate and enthusiastic festival goers. The festival will commemorate of valuable book 20 years recommendations from librarians, film noir, games, investigations, discoveries, professional exchanges, and mediation activities centred around books.



REOPENING OF HAUTS-DE-FRANCE'S MATISSE MUSEUM Le Cateau-Cambresis, Hauts-de-France June 2024

RECENTLY ADDED

This museum, where the artist was born in 1862, will reopen this year following a multi-million-euro investment. The refurbishment will see additional gallery space added as well as a new reception, shop and workshop areas. Home to the third-largest collection of Matisse artworks in France and just two hours from Calais, not far from Cambrai, it is a museum that has evolved several times since first opening in November 1952. It now contains almost 400 works by Matisse, Herbin and Claisse as well as artists who worked alongside Matisse. Until the current renovation it wasn't possible to display all these artworks, but the additional space will enable this, as well as further expansion of the collection. Link

#### REOPENING OF MAISON VERMOREL Beaujolais, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes June/July 2024

The Maison Vermorel, one of Villefranche-sur-Saône's outstanding heritage buildings, is set to open its doors in summer 2024 as a newly designed, communal place of joie de vivre. The renovation is creating three areas, the star being a culinary centre with bistronomic restaurant named Les Tables Vermorel. The other two areas are economic - offices and meeting rooms - and cultural, enabling education projects, artistic programmes, exhibitions and museographic spaces on the history of the site, the building and the Vermorel family. REOPENING OF ÎLE SAINT-HONORAT'S FORTIFIED TOWER-MONASTERY Cannes, Région Sud Summer 2024

Off the coast of Cannes, the <u>island of Saint-Honorat</u> (one of the two Lérins islands, alongside Ile Sainte-Marguérite) is home to an 11th-century abbey, whose fortified tower-monastery is nearing the end of its restoration. This listed historic monument has undergone emergency and safety work on its roof and ceilings, restoration of the cloister section and restoration of the southern part and the interiors, to improve the visitor experience.

OPENING OF MUSEUM FERMAT IN BEAUMONT-DE-LOMAGNE Tarn-et-Garonne, Occitanie Summer 2024

This eagerly-awaited museum will combine history, science and fun, paying tribute to Pierre de Fermat, famous mathematician and genius of the 17th century. The building is also Fermat's birthplace and will offer visitors a new must-see attraction in Tarn-et-Garonne, showcasing his history and famous theorem. The new museum will blend the traditional and the cutting-edge, looking at mathematics through Fermat's discoveries and also featuring exhibitions linked to current issues such as artificial intelligence.

#### REOPENING OF NOTRE-DAME CATHEDRAL TOWERS Paris Île-de-France 8 December 2024

Following the fire that partially destroyed its upper section, the reopening of the towers and treasury of <u>Paris' Notre-Dame Cathedral</u> has been announced for 8 December 2024, with a Te Deum service planned for 15 April, exactly five years after the fire. The restoration has been entrusted to architect Philippe Villeneuve, with the general principle to rebuild the cathedral identically, including the spire. Final delivery of the redevelopment of the forecourt and the surroundings of Notre-Dame is scheduled for 2027.



STRASBOURG: WORLD BOOK CAPITAL 2024 Strasbourg, Grand-Est 2024

In July 2022, Strasbourg became the first French city to be awarded the World Book Capital title for 2024. The 'Lire Notre Monde' project will focus on five key areas of development: city of crossroads and debate; city of creativity and poetry; city of refuge; city of ecology and city of child-friendliness. From November 2022 until 2025, a range of events are taking place to explore and showcase Strasbourg's links with writers, literature and printing from a variety of angles. Link



FIVE AUBUSSON TAPESTRIES DEPICTING IMAGINARY WORLDS OF JAPANESE ANIMATOR HAYAO MIYAZAKI Aubusson, Nouvelle-Aquitaine Completion 2024

The Cité Internationale de la Tapisserie signed an agreement with Studio Ghibli Inc. to produce a series of five monumental Aubusson tapestries based on major films by master of Japanese animation, Hayao Miyazaki. Four tapestries have so far been created, from the films *Princess Mononoké*, *The Voyage of Chihiro* and *The Moving Castle*. The entire hanging will be completed by the end of 2024. In order for a tapestry to be considered an Aubusson, it must be woven in the Creuse area of France.

20TH GRANDE ODYSSÉE ANNIVERSARY VVF Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 13-25 January 2024

This annual dog sled race is the most demanding stage race in an Alpine setting, each year bringing together over 65 mushers and their 600 dogs from all over Europe in the stunning landscapes of Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes. Beginning in Megève on 13 January, the dogs and mushers will cover an average of 17km per day before finishing on 25 January in Villard-de-Lans. Around 20 Alpine resorts are celebrating, with a range of activities on offer for the 50,000 expected spectators.

50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ANGOULÊME INTERNATIONAL COMICS FESTIVAL

Angoulême, Nouvelle-Aquitaine 25-28 January 2024

Founded by French writers and editors Francis Groux, Jean Mardikian and Claude Moliterni to highlight the diversity of comic strip art and manga artists, the <u>Festival de la Bande Dessinée d'Angoulême</u> has now been taking place for 50 years. The four-day event attracts up to 7,000 professionals and showcases comics artist creations, for which prestigious industry prizes are awarded. The festival is the second largest in Europe and the third worldwide, attracting over 200,000 visitors.



135TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE COMPLETION OF THE EIFFEL TOWER Paris Île-de-France 31 March 2024

Originally conceived and built for the 1889 World Fair, the Eiffel Tower was finished in only two years and two months on 31 March 1889. The date coincided with the 100th anniversary of the French Revolution. The Eiffel Tower was not meant to be permanent and at the time was criticised; however, the 300-metre-tall steel tower conceived by engineer and entrepreneur Gustave Eiffel quickly became one of the French capital's major monuments and is until today the most visited and recognisable monument of Paris Link

90TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF MARIE CURIE Paris Île-de-France 4 July 2024

The first woman to win a Nobel Prize, Marie Curie was a Polish and French physicist and chemist who conducted pioneering research on radioactivity. She is remembered for her discovery of radium and polonium and for her huge contribution to finding treatments for cancer. In 1906, she became the first female professor at the University of Paris. Until 2014, Marie Curie was the first woman to be enshrined in the Panthéon in Paris on her own merits. Musée Curie is a dedicated museum to Marie Curie where visitors can follow in the footsteps of this fascinating lady.

60TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MAEGHT FOUNDATION Saint-Paul-de-Vence, Région Sud 26 July 2024

The Maeght Foundation on the Côte d'Azur was opened in 1964 by celebrated writer and Minister for Culture, André Malraux. At the time, it was France's very first private art institution, modelled on American institutions such as the Guggenheim Foundation and the Barnes and Phillips Collections. To coincide with the 60th anniversary, a significant expansion to its exhibition spaces is being built and a major exhibition - Amitiés, Bonnard-Matisse pour les 60 ans de la Fondation Maeght - will be held from 29 June 2024.

50TH DEAUVILLE AMERICAN FILM FESTIVAL Deauville, Normandy September 2024

Arguably the biggest French film festival after Cannes, the Deauville American Film Festival takes place every year in the glamorous seaside resort of Deauville. The festival premieres over 100 films every year, from burgeoning independent producers to acclaimed Hollywood directors. Deauville will host its 50th festival in September 2024 and is the only festival in the world to offer film screenings 24 hours a day over ten days. In addition, Deauville's famous boardwalk, Les Planches, is 100 years old this year (2023).

## **ANNIVERSARIES**

300TH ANNIVERSARY OF MAISON RÉMY MARTIN Cognac, Nouvelle-Aquitaine 2024

In 2024, the <u>Rémy Martin</u> cognac house will be marking 300 years of exceptional cognac-making. Led by visionaries since 1724, the Maison will connect past, present and future with a year of special events, activities and products around the theme 'We Dream Forward'. For three centuries Rémy Martin has combined craft and innovation, passing it forward to build sustainable exception for the future. #### 900TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIRTH OF ELEANOR OF AQUITAINE Nouvelle-Aquitaine 2024

First Queen of France and then Queen of England, Eleanor of Aquitaine was born around 1124. The region of Nouvelle-Aquitaine is continuing the celebrations that it started in 2022 for her 900th anniversary. This year, workshops have been offered to volunteers by local artist Marie Sirgue and embroiderer Margot Nirod, to create an enormous embroidered representation of Eleanor's effigy housed in the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud in the Loire Valley. Entitled 'La Dame', the creation is expected to be put on display in Poitiers in January 2024. Link

#### 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MILLAU VIADUCT Millau, Occitanie 2024

At 343 metres high and 2,460 metres long, the Millau Viaduct is a magnificent feat of engineering and holds the world record for the tallest bridge. Conceived by French engineer Michel Virlogeux and designed by English architect Lord Norman Foster. In this anniversary year, take the opportunity to explore it in a number of ways: on foot on a 40-minute guided tour to learn the history of its construction; in a canoe or rowing boat to appreciate the majesty of the structure from below; or from above in a paraglider or hangglider.





35TH BIRTHDAY OF PARC ASTERIX AND 65TH BIRTHDAY
OF CHARACTER ASTERIX
Plailly, Hauts-de-France
2024

In 2024, Astérix, the Gauls' most famous character, will be celebrating a double anniversary: his 65th birthday and the 35th anniversary of the park dedicated to him in Plailly, in the Oise department. The year will be punctuated by numerous events and the arrival of new attractions at Parc Astérix, which attracted in excess of 2.8 million visitors in 2023. This anniversary year should enable it to set a new record, with an extended calendar to include all Wednesdays and weekends in September. Link

#### 10TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MUSÉE SOULAGES Rodez, Occitanie 2024

The French artist to whom this museum is dedicated, Pierre Soulages, died in 2022 at the age of 102 - making this year an especially poignant time to visit, alongside the museum's 10th anniversary. Soulages was born in Rodez in 1919, he is known for his exploration of the medium of paint itself and for the extraordinary textures on his canvases. His creation of the stained glass windows in Conques forms the core of this museum, which also features a temporary exhibition gallery - "Les Derniers Soulages" runs until 7 January 2024 - and an ingenious gourmet bistro designed to correspond with Soulages' work. #### 70TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF HENRI MATISSE Nice, Région Sud 2024

Henri Matisse was not only an illustrious painter but also a draughtsman, sculptor and printer. His artworks overflow with intense colourism and have strongly marked the Post-Impressionism, Modernism and Fauvism movements. Some of his most iconic works are *Woman with a Hat* (1905), *The Joy of Life* (1906), *Nu Bleu* (1907), *La Danse* (1909), *L'Atelier Rouge* (1911) and *The Snail* (1953). Admire his art at the Matisse Museum in Nice - alongside a visit to the Chapelle Matisse in nearby Vence.



# 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIRTH OF IMPRESSIONISM



150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIRTH OF IMPRESSIONISM Paris Île-de-France and Normandy April – September 2024

In April 1874, a group of around 30 French artists opened their own exhibition having been refused to exhibit at the Paris Salon. Together the group showcased over 150 paintings, with one by Monet - Impression, Sunrise - giving its name to a new artistic movement. Fast forward 150 years, and Normandy and Ile-de-France will be the places to be for art and culture lovers in 2024, with a series of special Impressionist exhibitions. A core part of the anniversary celebrations will be Normandy's annual Impressionist Festival (22 March-22 September 2024). Highlights in Paris and Ile-de-France include exhibitions on Vincent van Gogh (until 4 February 2024), Paris 1874 (26 March-14 July 2024) and Gustave Caillebotte (autumn 2024) at the Musée d'Orsay; Van Gogh (until 29 September 2024) at the Chateau d'Auvers-sur-Oise; and Berthe Morisot (until 3 March 2024) at the Musée Marmottan Monet.







## REMEMBRANCE

80TH ANNIVERSARY OF D-DAY AND THE BATTLE OF NORMANDY Normandy

May - August 2024

Normandy will forever be marked by the D-Day Landings and the Battle of Normandy, which led to the liberation of France and Europe. The year 2024 will mark the 80th anniversary, a momentous occasion to celebrate peace, liberty and reconciliation. At the core of celebrations will be the annual D-Day Festival (1-16 June 2024), involving a rich cultural programme of parachuting, parades, concerts, exhibitions and historic reenactments along the entire Norman coastline from Pegasus Bridge to Sainte-Mère-Eglise. This will also be a good time to visit the British Normandy Memorial in Ver-Sur-Mer. A CONSERVATION CAMPAIGN FOR ORADOUR-SUR-GLANE'S 80TH Nouvelle-Aquitaine 10 June 2024

The year 2024 also marks the 80th anniversary of the Nazi massacre of 643 innocent victims in the martyred village of Oradour-sur-Glane on 10 June 1944. The Ministry of Culture has so far maintained the village and its remains, but the passage of time and bad weather have led to erosion of the ruins, which now require more extensive conservation work. #### PARIS 2024 OLYMPIC FLAME TO ARRIVE IN MARSEILLE 8 May 2024

The Olympic Flame will first be lit in Olympia on 16 April 2024, in accordance with ancient tradition. After a 12-day relay through Greece and a crossing of the Mediterranean aboard the famous three-masted ship, the Belem, it will officially arrive into the port of Marseille on 8 May, heralding the return of the Games to France after a 100-year wait. In Marseille, the Flame will pass through two emblematic sites: the new Roucas Blanc's Marina starting point for the solo dinghies, windsurfers and formula kites - and the Vélodrome Stadium.

Paris je t'aime (the Paris Tourist Office) has set up a new hybrid venue showcasing urban sport, culture and Olympism. Serving as a tourist information point, Olympics ticket office and official shop, alongside a café dedicated to Parisian products, SPOT24 also comprises an immersive Olympic exhibition. Co-presented by the Olympic Museum in Lausanne, it highlights the six newest Olympic disciplines: skateboarding, sport climbing, BMX freestyle, surfing, 3X3 basketball and breaking. A full programme of cultural activities and introductory sports sessions accompanies the exhibition, running throughout 2024.

## **SPORTING EVENTS**

50TH PARIS JUDO GRAND SLAM Paris Île-de-France 2-4 February 2024

The <u>Paris Grand Slam</u> is the most important international tournament for professional judokas, who fight it out on the tatami mats of Paris' Accor Arena in front of over 24,000 spectators. Held just a few months before the Paris 2024 Games, this 50th edition of the tournament will be an opportunity for the judokas to score the final points in their bids to secure a place in the Games.

4TH 'NATURE IS BIKE': GRAVEL AND ADVENTURE CYCLING FESTIVAL Angers, Pays de la Loire 16-18 June 2024

France's first nature-focused gravel bike festival returns to Angers in 2024 for its fourth year. Nature is Bike was born from the desire to promote the practice of gravel biking around a festival dedicated to the outdoors and living well. The next event will see new routes and rides, a Bike Show featuring leading brands and hottest cycling destinations, and a gravel forum. Enjoy food and drink, live music and activities in and around Angers, which sits at the crossroads of three major cycle routes that are enjoyed by 200,000 cyclists and cycle tourists every year.



A NEW FINISH FOR THE TOUR DE FRANCE 2024 Nice, Région Sud 21 July 2024

For the first time in the Tour's history, the Grand Boucle will finish outside of Paris in order to avoid the preparations for the Olympic and Paralympic Games a week later. After a race through Burgundy, the Massif Central, the Pyrenees and the Alps, a mountainous course from Nice to Col de la Couillole has been designed for the 20th stage (20 July). The 21st and final stage will be contested in a 35km time trial on 21 July between Monaco and Place Masséna in Nice.

10TH VENDÉE GLOBE SOLO SAILING RACE Les Sables-d'Olonne, Pays de la Loire 10 November 2024

Nicknamed the 'Everest of the Seas', the Vendée Globe is the toughest solo sailing race in the world - a 24,000-mile circumnavigation of the world, without stops or assistance. It takes place every four years - the 2020 race was won by Frenchman Yannick Bestaven. Five British skippers are campaigning to be on the 2024 start line on 10 November, with the fleet expected to return to Les Sables-d'Olonne in January 2025. The new Hotel Vertime will be opening in Les Sables in 2024, in time to accommodate race-going visitors.

## SUSTAINABLE TOURISM

BORDEAUX IS 9TH DESTINATION WORLDWIDE IN GDS INDEX Bordeaux, Nouvelle-Aquitaine 4 October 2023

The Global Destination Sustainability Index (GDS Index), a benchmark international barometer that analyses the responsible performance of destinations, unveiled its 2023 rankings on 4 October. With an overall score of 87.1%, Bordeaux continues to progress for the fifth consecutive year, confirming its position as a responsible destination. With a score of 87.1%, Bordeaux scores two points higher than in 2022, when it was in 5th place with 85.1%. This year, over 104 destinations took part in the barometer, compared with 65 in 2022. FRANCE'S STRATEGY TO REGULATE TOURIST FLOWS
Across France
2023-2024

France's tourism minister Olivia Grégoire has unveiled a plan to regulate visitor flows at the most popular sites and in terms of seasonality. The government acknowledges that 80% of annual tourism activity is concentrated on just 20% of the country, hence the push to encourage visitors to discover less well known parts of France. For now, the government is setting up an industry monitoring group to identify the most at-risk sites and craft strategies to encourage off-season visits. Limits are already being set, with officials capping day visits to the Breton island of Brehat at 4,700 during the peak summer months.

NEW ATTRACTIONS AT THE GROTTE DE LA PIERRE DE VOLVIC Volvic, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 2023-2024

This former Volvic stone quarry, in operation since the end of the 13th century, offers a daytime exploration of the Volvic of yesteryear and traces the intertwined history of the region's two riches: stone and natural mineral water. From the beginning of December 2023, it will be staging a series of new tours that take advantage of the special atmosphere of the site, with visual effects, mapping and sound effects: the Grotte du Père Noël (Father Christmas Grotto) and the Grotte des Lumières (Cave of Lights). CAUTERETS SKI RESORT LAUNCHES ECO ACCOMMODATION LABEL Cauterets, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 2023-2024

Cauterets is launching its new <u>'Label Cauterets'</u> to promote energy-efficient accommodation. UNESCO Global Geoparks are single, unified geographical areas where sites and landscapes of international geological significance are managed with a holistic concept of protection, education and sustainable development. The <u>Parc naturel régional Normandie-Maine</u> is a protected area of forest and bocage stretching across the regions of Normandy and Pays de la Loire incorporating the Alpes Mancelles in Sarthe. Its UNESCO label will help to boost the attractiveness of the area for both residents and tourists and bolster resilience in the face of climate change and the threat to biodiversity.

**RESTAURANT COCO IN LYON** Lyon, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 17 July 2023

Following the success of CoCo Paris at Opéra Garnier, CoCo has taken over the Gare des Brotteaux in Lyon, offering a refined culinary experience in another sumptuous historic setting. Designed by architect Corinne Sachot, who was also behind the Paris project, the architecture and decor of Coco Lyon are captivating. As in Paris, we find palm carpeting, shimmering velvets, dark woods with mahogany highlights and Napoleon III lacquers.



LES HALLES DE LA CARTOUCHERIE: A NEW FOODIE SPOT Toulouse, Occitanie 8 September 2023

The former Halles de la Cartoucherie has been transformed into a combined catering, coworking, sports and cultural centre, and opened its doors on 8 September 2023. This successful conversion of an emblematic 19th-century industrial building is bringing new life to an emerging sector of Toulouse, showcasing its architectural heritage and promoting local produce. It's set to become the new go-to place for people who love the atmosphere and flavours of the Occitanie region.

#### THE FIRST EVER FRENCH FRIES WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS Arras, Hauts-de-France

7 October 2023 (to become annual)

On 7 October 2023, the historic city of Arras hosted the first ever French Fries World Championships. This public one-day event included contests in various categories ('Authentic', 'Creative', 'Best Sauce') between catering professionals and amateur experts, alongside fries tastings, local craft beer and entertainment - all in the beautiful setting of Arras' Grand-Place. Arras is situated in Hauts-de-France, which was voted European Capital of Gastronomy for 2023. There are some 1,400 French fry stalls throughout France, 55% of which can be found in this region.



#### RESTAURANT LE DEAUVILLE Deauville, Normandy 1 November 2023

The Beaumarly group, whose Parisian restaurants are well known (Café Beaubourg, Café Français, Le Georges, Le Café Marly, Café Ruc, Maison du Caviar), is expanding its collection of establishments dedicated to French art de vivre by opening 'Le Deauville' in Deauville at the end of October, with a breathtaking view over the marina. The colourful, relaxed restaurant has been designed by internationally renowned interior architect and designer Martin Brudnizki in the glamorous spirit of the 1950s. The menu will feature Normandy produce and Costes signature dishes.





## **GASTRONOMY & WINE**

BORDEAUX WINE FESTIVAL Bordeaux, Nouvelle-Aquitaine 27-30 June 2024

Each year, the <u>Bordeaux Wine Festival</u> recreates the mythical Wine Route, a journey through the vineyards where no less than 80 appellations are represented. Along the quays of the Garonne, winegrowers and sellers welcome you to their pavilions for tastings of white, red, rosé, clairet and crémant. The weekend prior to the festival (20-23 June 2024) sees the 'Avant-Première' events, acting as tasters and showing visitors a different way to taste wine while discovering interesting places.



OSCAR, SECOND RESTAURANT BY TOP CHEF'S DAVID GALLIENNE OPENING AT GIVERNY'S IMPRESSIONISM MUSEUM Giverny, Normandy Apring 2024

Just in time for this year's 150th anniversary of the birth of Impressionism, chef David Gallienne - who starred in Season 11 of *Top Chef* and already has one restaurant in Giverny - is due to open another, named Oscar, at the Musée des Impressionismes. Very little has been revealed about this new bucolic restaurant, except that we can already assume that it will feature the finest seasonal produce, as locavore as possible, as the chef is accustomed to using and showcasing. Gallienne's other restaurant in Giverny is the Michelin-starred Jardin des Plumes, inherited from chef Eric Guérin.



NEWLY RENOVATED RESTAURANT PAUL BOCUSE CELEBRATES 100TH ANNIVERSARY Collonges-au-Mont-d'Or, Lyon, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes

On the northern outskirts of Lyon, two-Michelin-star Restaurant Paul Bocuse underwent its first renovation in 30 years between September and December 2023, just in time for its 100th birthday in 2024. The work involved repairing the paintwork, renovating the masonry and restoring the frescoes, while the facade of the restaurant - a listed monument - remained unchanged and has been redone identically. Work was overseen by Roche & Cie, who specialise in the renovation of Lyon's heritage, alongside Cité Création and Ateliers Meyer. The restaurant continued to operate as normal during the renovation.


