2025: WHAT'S NEW IN FRANCE?

Updated edition February 2025

With a wide range of openings and reopenings, anniversaries, foodie milestones, sporting events, transport novelties and brand new accommodation, 2025 is a dynamic year to visit France! Read on to find out more about the exciting things coming to France this year.

The provisional figures for visitor numbers and revenue in 2024 are very encouraging: 100 million international visitors to France (+2 million from 2023) and €71 billion in international revenue (+12% from 2023). The end-of-year holidays benefitted from a 'rebound effect', with ski resorts recording an occupancy rate of 85%, up 5.5% from 2023.

The UK remained in the top three outbound markets for overnight stays in the first half of 2024. Brits continue to be the top international nationality for the winter season. With 3.5 million overnight stays during winter 2024, British visitors exceeded 2023 figures - which were already higher than pre-Covid levels - by 8.4%. Campsites throughout the country saw an increase in overnight stays by European tourists during summer 2024, including the British (+5% from 2023).

38% of the 9.5 million tickets sold for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games events were purchased by international visitors, with the UK in the top three countries holding tickets, along with the US and Germany. There were 1.6 million international visitors in Ile-de-France during the Games (23 July - 11 August 2024), 8% of whom were British (almost 131,000 British visitors, 22% more than the same period in 2023).

The outlook for the **first quarter of 2025** is very positive, with an increase in visitor numbers: +10% in international air arrivals during Q1 and +7 percentage points in hotel occupancy in the capital in January.

UNVEILING OF THE LOUVRE-LENS' GALLERY OF TIME Lens, Hauts-de-France 4 December 2024

Sister to the iconic Paris museum, the Louvre-Lens is a cultural gem in the crown of Northern France. Its <u>Gallery of Time</u> has undergone a total revamp, the first since the museum opened in 2012. It reopened before Christmas free of charge to all visitors and embodies the museum's commitment to making art and culture accessible. It's a unique space in the museum world that makes it possible to embrace 5,000 years of history in art and the humanities in a single gaze, including 443 works lent by the Paris Louvre.

REOPENING OF CÉZANNE'S FORMER HOME AND STUDIO IN AIX-EN-PROVENCE Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Spring 2025

Aix-en-Provence is in for a major Cézanne celebration in 2025 with the reopening of two major artistic sites: his studio, housing the models for his final still-life paintings, his furniture, equipment and objects dear to him; and his family home at Jas de Bouffan, listed as a historic monument. A guided tour will tell you what this property meant to the painter: an anchor point, the theatre for his first paintings and a creative studio. Cézanne's favourite views, which appeared in around 50 of his oils and watercolours, are also on display in the house. Also don't miss the Bibémus quarry, where he used to paint, while in Aix - and wander the streets that marked the life, outlook and work of this father of modern painting.

REOPENING OF NOTRE-DAME CATHEDRAL Paris, Île-de-France 7 & 8 December 2024

Five and a half years after the fire that partially destroyed its upper section, the <u>public reopening</u> of <u>Paris' Notre-Dame Cathedral</u> took place on 7 & 8 December 2024, organised via a free online ticketing service. The official inauguration on 7 December comprised the 'awakening' of the organ, a liturgical celebration including a blessing, a Magnificat or a Te Deum, and vespers. The first Mass took place on 8 December, with the consecration of the altar. The restoration was entrusted to architect Philippe Villeneuve, with the general principle to rebuild the cathedral identically, including the spire. Final delivery of the redevelopment of the forecourt and the surroundings of Notre-Dame is scheduled for 2027, preceded by the stained glass windows in 2026.





Miss France, one of the oldest-running national beauty contests, is set to have its history displayed in a museum in Saint-Raphaël on the glamorous Côte-d'Azur. Mayor Frédéric Masquelier and the Miss France Society announced the opening of the Miss France Museum in Saint-Raphaël in 2025, housed in an elegant Belle-Époque villa. Visitors will be taken on a journey through the history of the Miss France competition, complete with an impressive collection of over 100 unique costumes worn by Miss France hopefuls over the decades, winners' crowns, paintings, and video extracts of must-see moments. Saint-Raphaël is where France won the Miss World title in 1953, with Denise Perrier.

NEAR EASTERN ANTIQUITIES IN DIALOGUE: THE MET AT THE LOUVRE Paris, Île-de-France Until 28 September 2025

The Louvre's Department of Near-Eastern Antiquities is hosting 10 major works from New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art, whose Department of Ancient Near-Eastern Art is currently closed for renovation. These 'special guest' artworks from the Met, dating from between the late 4th millennium BC and the 5th century AD, show some remarkable connections with the Louvre's own collection. Representing Central Asia, Syria, Iran and Mesopotamia, this dialogue between collections and works of art reintroduces visitors to these extraordinary, ageold artefacts and the stories they tell.



FINAL YEAR TO VISIT THE CENTRE POMPIDOU BEFORE 2030 Paris, Île-de-France Until end September 2025

The iconic Centre Pompidou closes this September until 2030 for a <u>major renovation programme</u>. Supported by the Ministry for Culture, the renovation will remove asbestos from all facades, enhance fire safety, improve accessibility for people with reduced mobility and optimise energy efficiency for the whole building. The project also presents an opportunity to create a new large-scale cultural project for the Centre, which will continue to reflect and support contemporary creation as it engages with societal issues. The exhibition areas and bookshop will be progressively closed over the summer, with complete closure planned for the end of September.





THE FULL REOPENING OF THE GRAND PALAIS Paris, Île-de-France June 2025

RECENTLY

Following its partial opening of the Nave and surrounding galleries to host the fencing and taekwondo disciplines at the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, the <u>Grand Palais</u> is undergoing the second phase of its restoration and is set to fully reopen in June this year. Work has been taking place since March 2021 across the three buildings that make up the emblematic site, which was built for the 1900 Universal Exhibition. The total work involves restoration of the façades, statues and interior decoration, as well as new technical installations and improved accessibility. The Grand Palais and Palais de la Découverte will have one unified entrance.

CARTIER FOUNDATION TO OPEN NEW ART MUSEUM IN LOUVRE SAINT-HONORÉ BUILDING AS IT CELEBRATES 40TH ANNIVERSARY Paris, Île-de-France 2025

The <u>Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain</u> is moving to a new location: the Louvre des Antiquaires on Place du Palais-Royal in Paris, opening to the public in 2025. The building's interiors have been renovated by Jean Nouvel, the same architect who designed the foundation's current premises on Boulevard Raspail in 1994. Compared to the strikingly modern building of glass and steel that Fondation Cartier currently inhabits, the new location is a classical Haussmannian building, formerly a five-star hotel in 1855 before becoming a department store in 1863. Since 1978, it has been known as the Louvre des Antiquaires and has housed hundreds of antique shops and galleries.

THE CAEN MILLENNIUM Caen, Normandy 2025

Caen will be celebrating 1,000 years of history in 2025! Locals, Normandy residents and visitors will unite to mark this historic anniversary through a full programme of artistic and cultural events. The <u>Caen Millennium</u> is designed to shine a spotlight on the many areas that contribute to its unique character - culture, arts and sciences, research and economy - and unite all those who make Caen what it is today: residents, civil society organisations, local authorities, institutions and businesses. Beyond the atmosphere generated by the public festivities, the Millennium will create a 'before and after' in the history of the city.

FRANCE'S FIRST UBISOFT ENTERTAINMENT CENTRE Béziers, Occitanie 2025

Ubisoft and Storyland Studios announced the development of the world's first <u>Ubisoft Entertainment Centre</u> at Studios Occitanie Méditerranée. This multibrand themed entertainment experience is the first in a series of centres that will immerse fans and newcomers in fully interactive worlds based on Ubisoft's popular game franchises. Located in Béziers on France's Mediterranean coast, a 40-minute drive from Montpellier, the 88-hectare mixed development will include a professional film studio, multiple entertainment offerings, retail, dining, and hospitality.

REOPENING OF TOULOUSE'S FINE ARTS MUSEUM Toulouse, Occitanie End of 2025

Housed in a former 14th-century convent, the <u>Musée des Augustins</u> has undergone many changes over the years - but most recently, new works have been needed to resolve structural problems and respond to new cultural uses. Archaeological excavations have been carried out since 2021, while the interior layout of the Gothic halls, church and painting salon has been reconfigured. The new reception building will open onto a redeveloped forecourt and change the relationship between the monument and its surroundings.

OPENING OF THE NEWLY RESTORED PORTE SAINT-JACQUES Cognac, Nouvelle-Aquitaine 2025

The historic fortified entrance to the town of <u>Cognac</u> dates back to the 12th century and has undergone various architectural phases and roles since its inception, occupying a strategic position west of Cognac to control traffic across the River Charente, and key to the town's commerce, trade and defence. Its restoration is expected to conclude in 2025. Until the reopening, you can visit the 'Coulisses du Chantier' (building works) for a €5 contribution to this ongoing restoration project. The town makes the ideal starting point for exploring the wider Cognac area, visiting winemakers and Cognac houses during distillation and beyond.





ANNIVERSARIES

20 YEARS OF THE LOIRE À VÉLO Centre-Val de Loire & Pays de la Loire 2025

It's 20 years since the first section of the <u>Loire à Vélo</u> opened, today a 900km cycle route winding its way through the majestic Loire Valley, and the westernmost section of EuroVelo 6. Much of the Loire Valley is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and along the trail you stick to France's last great wild river, with its sandy banks and islands, vine-covered slopes, picturesque towns and villages, and fine food and wine. The route ends at the Loire's Atlantic estuary. There are over 700 cyclist-friendly 'Accueil Vélo' places to stay within a 5km radius and a train along the route accommodates bikes in summer.

150 YEARS OF MAURICE RAVEL 7 March 2025

Born near St-Jean-de-Luz in the Basque Country, Maurice Ravel (1875-1937) was one of the most eminent composers of the 20th century, renowned for his complex compositions. He was introduced by his father to Erik Satie, whose distinctive personality and unorthodox music had a strong influence on Ravel, and he studied with Gabriel Fauré. Some of his best known works include *Boléro*, *Daphnis & Chloé* and *Pavane pour une infante défunte*. Ravel's Museum House in Montfort-l'Amaury, near Paris, is open for guided tours by reservation.

300 YEARS OF PASQUALE PAOLI, CORSICA'S PATRIOTIC LEADER 6 April 2025

In 1755, Corsican patriot Pasquale Paoli (1725-1807) proclaimed independence from the Genoese after five centuries of occupation. This celebrated leader gave Corsica a democratic constitution and founded the island's university. Corsicans refer to him as 'U Babbu di a Patria': the Father of the People. A museum dedicated to Paoli is located close to Ponte Leccia, where he was born. The museum is a classified 'Maison des Illustres', a label awarded to places that preserve the memory of key players in the political, social and cultural history of France.



50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF JOSEPHINE BAKER 12 April 2025

Josephine Baker (1906-1975) was an American dancer, singer, actress and civil rights activist who found fame as an expatriate in France. Beyond her theatrical success, Baker was a courageous advocate for racial equality, participating in the French Resistance. In April 1975 Baker performed at the Bobino Theatre but died just days later. She was the first American woman in history to receive French military honours, as well as being the first black woman interred at the Panthéon. Her former home in Dordogne, the 15th-century Château des Milandes, is open to visitors and has exquisite formal gardens.

80TH VE DAY (VICTORY IN EUROPE DAY) 8 May 2025

Following the success of D-Day's 80th in June 2024, efforts will be turning to the celebration of the 80th anniversary of VE Day which marked the end of the war in Europe and WWII as a whole on 8 May 1945. We expect a ceremony to take place in Reims, where Germany's surrender was signed.





ANNIVERSARIES

80TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE LIBERATION OF THE 'SAINT-NAZAIRE POCKET' Saint-Nazaire, Pays de la Loire 11 May 2025

When German soldiers stabilised a front between the Vilaine and Pornic rivers in summer 1944, they enclosed 124,000 civilians in an area of 1,800 km² known as the 'Saint-Nazaire Pocket' (la Poche de Saint-Nazaire). While France was otherwise liberated, local residents had to endure a further nine months of occupation with bombings, severe food restrictions and no electricity. The area was the last French territory to be liberated, on 11 May 1945 following the German surrender. Various events are being organised to mark the anniversary: the 'Bal des Empochés' (Liberty Ball) on 10 May; a display of portraits of Resistance fighters; a fireworks display on the theme of the Liberation on 13 July; and a major exhibition running from June to September on the reinvented city (1945-1955-2025) at submarine base-turned-cultural centre LiFE.

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF ERIK SATIE 1 July 2025

Born in Normandy, French composer and pianist Erik Satie (1866-1925) left an indelible mark on the world of music. Known for his avant-garde compositions like *Gymnopédies* and *Gnossiennes*, he challenged traditional musical norms with his minimalist style and unique harmonies. In his later years his best friends were painters, but he was deeply admired by fellow composers Ravel and Debussy, of whom he was an intimate friend for close to 30 years. Visitors can enjoy the audio-guided musical trail at the <u>Maisons Satie</u> in Honfleur, in the house where he was born.

RECENTLY ADDED

150 YEARS OF THE PALAIS GARNIER 5 January 2025 AND 200 YEARS OF CHARLES GARNIER 6 November 2025

Paris' Palais Garnier opened its doors on 5 January 1875 and, since then, has built a rich of artistic creation, with 172 performances per season and over a million visitors each year. To celebrate its 150th anniversary, the Paris Opera is organising a series of events throughout 2025, with special concerts, exhibitions, encounters, a behindthe-scenes documentary, themed tours and artist residencies. The anniversary of the building aligns perfectly with the 200th anniversary of the birth of its architect, Charles Garnier, in 1825. Educated at the École des Beaux-Arts. Garnier's influence extended beyond his buildings to his writings, which continue to inspire architects today.





1,000 YEARS OF THE CHATEAU DE MONTREUIL-BELLAY Near Saumur, Pays de la Loire 2025

One of the lesser-known Loire châteaux, Montreuil-Bellay was founded in 1025 on the banks of the Thouet river. As well as an imposing 600-metre-long wall flanked by towers, it has a network of vast, vaulted cellars and a vineyard producing red, white, rosé and sparkling wines. Visitors walk in the footsteps of the Duchess of Longueville, rebellious cousin of Louis XIV; learn about the suffering of the women imprisoned here and the care given to 1,000 wounded soldiers during the First World War. The village of Montreuil-Bellay is a 'Petite Cité de Caractère' crossed by the Loire à Vélo and Vélo Francette cycle routes.



GASTRONOMY & WINE

EUROPE'S HIGHEST WINE BAR OPENS IN VAL THORENS Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Winter 2024-25 season

The iconic Cime Caron summit has been undergoing transformations in the last few years, and thanks to cutting-edge technology at an altitude of 3,200m, the new Caron 3200 complex will be opening in <u>Val Thorens</u> for the winter season 2024-25. The challenge has been met by regional development specialist SETAM to provide new facilities up high and improve the visitor experience. The complex will include a 130-seat restaurant, a wine bar, a rooftop and a panoramic terrace as well as a space for events and seminars. This building represents the final piece in the various stages to transform the Cime Caron.

10TH UNESCO BIRTHDAY FOR CHAMPAGNE'S SPARKLING HERITAGE Champagne, Grand Est 2025

In 2025, the 'Coteaux, Maisons et Caves de Champagne' (Champagne's Hillsides, Houses and Cellars) will celebrate the 10th anniversary of their inclusion on the UNESCO World Heritage List. The designation comprises three core areas: the historic Coteaux de Cumières in Mareuil-sur-Aÿ, the Avenue de Champagne in Épernay and the Colline Saint-Nicaise in Reims, plus 320 towns and villages. The festivities will be extended throughout the year and across the whole of Champagne, with the objective to make the people of Champagne proud of the beauty of their heritage and to raise the profile of the region even higher on the international stage.

NANTES NAMED NEW GASTRONOMIC DESTINATION BY *LA LISTE* Pays de la Loire 2025

Nantes has been named a 'Nouvelle Destination Gastronomique' for 2025 by world-leading ranking and restaurants guide La Liste, represented by four local chefs: Éric Guérin (La Mare aux Oiseaux), Mathieu Pérou (Le Manoir de la Régate), Sarah Mainguy (Vacarme and Freia) and Lucie Berthier (Sépia). Nantes' tourist office has been developing the city's food scene for the last decade and publishes the annual Tables de Nantes guide, highlighting the best restaurants in the area. The same prize in the international category was awarded to England, represented by chefs in London, Yorkshire and Cumbria. A food-themed press trip to Nantes and the surrounding area will be run in late March.

15TH UNESCO BIRTHDAY OF THE 'REPAS GASTRONOMIQUE DES FRANÇAIS' Across France 2025

Inscribed in 2010 on the list of Intangible Cultural Heritage, France's 'gastronomic meal' is a customary social practice designed to celebrate important life moments. Its components include the careful choice of dishes; the purchase of good local produce; the pairing of food and wine; table decoration; and specific gestures during tasting (smelling and tasting what is served at the table). The gastronomic meal must follow a clearly defined pattern: it begins with an aperitif and ends with a digestive, with at least four courses in between: a starter, fish and/or meat with vegetables, cheese and dessert. Gourmet meals bring family and friends closer together and, more generally, strengthen social ties.



SPORTING EVENTS

THE NEW MEGA BELL COURSE IN LA PLAGNE La Plagne, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 14-19 April 2025

La Mega Bell Course is a new springtime race series coming to La Plagne, its 'bells' a nod to the Easter This holiday timing. unique competition combines fun, creativity and challenge across five wacky races that will test the skills of even the most seasoned skiers. Expect the unexpected, as the official times will only tell part of the story; competitors can also earn bonus points, face penalties, and take clever shortcuts to keep the suspense alive until the very end. Competitors have two strategies to choose from: embrace the chaos with total improvisation on Saturday or take a more tactical approach by practising on the timed courses available from Monday to Friday, each one unveiled day by day.



TALL SHIPS RACES 2025 Le Havre, Normandy & Dunkirk, Hauts-de-France 4-13 July 2025

Considered Europe's largest free family event, the <u>Tall Ships Races</u> <u>2025</u> will start from Le Havre, Normandy, with three days of festivities from 4-7 July. The majestic 50-strong fleet will make its first stop in Dunkirk (Northern France) three days later on 10 July, staying there until 13 July. From Dunkirk, the fleet will head up the North Sea to Aberdeen and across to Norway's Kristiansand, before finishing in Esbjerg, Denmark. The Tall Ships Races are organised annually by Sail Training International. Ships from around the world gather to participate in competitive races, and to share and enjoy the ensuing shoreside festivities and celebrations. These events are youth-focused and bring a huge spectacle to the ports they call at.

RECENTLY

100 YEARS OF INTERNATIONAL PLAYERS AT THE FRENCH OPEN Paris, Île-de-France 19 May-8 June 2025 (tournament)

It was 1925 that the tennis tournament now known as the French Open was first opened to international players - prior to that, since its inauguration in 1891, the so-named 'French Clay Court Championships' was reserved for players registered with French clubs. The victories by Suzanne Lenglen and other French players led to the construction of the dedicated Roland-Garros stadium, named after an aviation pioneer who was killed in action during the First World War, which opened in 1928. The stadium is easily accessible by metro from central Paris, with several other attractions within walking distance.

EUROGAMES TO TAKE PLACE IN LYON Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes 23-26 July 2025

EuroGames are a sports-for-all event, open for participation irrespective of sex, age, sexual identity or physical ability - and this year, they are heading to Lyon. A total of 38 different disciplines are programmed, including some less prominent, non-Olympic sports such as dragon boat racing, ultimate frisbee and pétanque. The goal is to inform and raise awareness to fight discrimination in sport, uniting people from different backgrounds while minimising the environmental impact. Lyon is highly accessible from the UK by high-speed train, with departures from Paris every 30 minutes. The next EuroGames is planned for 2027 in Cardiff.



SPORTING EVENTS

THE TOUR DE FRANCE 2025 GRAND DÉPART FROM LILLE Lille and across Hauts-de-France 5 July 2025

In 2025, the <u>Tour de France</u>'s Grand Départ will focus on the qualities of the entire Hauts-de-France region, the Nord department and the European metropolis of Lille. The date of 5 July has been set for the first stage, whose route will form a loop around Lille. Next, the Pas-de-Calais department will have pride of place as the pack crosses it from east to west between Lauwin-Planque and Boulogne-sur-Mer. After that, the pack will set off from Valenciennes, which makes its return to the Tour route after a 34-year absence. Dunkirk, which hosted the Grand Départ in 2001, will be welcoming the finish of the third stage. Lastly, the start in Amiens will be the last opportunity to thank the inhabitants of the Hauts-de-France region for their welcome, before the Tour heads off to new horizons.



THE TOUR DE FRANCE FEMMES AVEC ZWIFT 2025 GRAND DÉPART FROM VANNES Vannes and across Brittany 26 July 2025

Edition four of the <u>Tour de France Femmes avec Zwift</u> will start in Brittany. The opening stage will be in the heart of the Morbihan department between Vannes and Plumelec, with the second in neighbouring Finistère between Brest and Quimper. It's a first for an event that has chosen to honour a region with such deep cycling roots. The 2025 edition will also mark a turning point in the history of the Tour de France Femmes avec Zwift, which will be contested over nine days of racing for the first time.



BWF-BADMINTON WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 2025 TO BE HELD IN PARIS Paris, Île-de-France 25-31 August 2025

The French Badminton Federation is organising the TotalEnergies <u>BWF World Championships</u> in Paris at the end of August. Taking place at the same buzzing venue used for the Paris 2024 Olympic badminton, the Adidas arena at Porte de la Chapelle, this major badminton event will bring together over 350 players from 50 countries to award the five titles of World Champions 2025. As many as 40,000 spectators are expected across the seven days. Paris was awarded the event in November 2018.



SUSTAINABLE TOURISM



OKKO HOTELS TO OPEN ENVIRONMENTALLY CERTIFIED HOTEL Troyes, Grand Est 2025

A 15th French Okko hotel is set to open in Troyes, Champagne, opposite the train station of this famous medieval city. Spread across seven floors, the hotel will offer 106 rooms, three meeting rooms and a fitness area, all enhanced by green outdoor spaces - but most importantly, will benefit from a BREEAM certification. BREEAM supports solutions to reduce carbon emissions to net zero, improve whole life performance, manage health and social impacts, and boost circularity, resilience and biodiversity. The hotel will be delivered in 2025 by Vinci Immobilier.

A HIGH-ALTITUDE GREENHOUSE AT ECO RESTAURANT L'ART DES METS Val d'Isère, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Summer 2025

Opening L'Art des Mets in the unspoilt Le Manchet Valley, Caroline and Emmanuel had their hearts set on creating an ecologicallyminded restaurant serving produce prepared on their own property. The majority of their ingredients are from the region: Savoie, Isère and Hautes-Alpes. Down the line, all waste is sorted and recycled. Vegetable peelings are fed to animals in a nearby farm, with pigs consuming many of the leftovers. The building itself has been renovated and reconfigured to optimise sustainable energy efficiency. By summer 2025, a greenhouse will be added to grow herbs and vegetables, all at an altitude of 1,900m. The restaurant is located at the crossroads of hiking and Nordic skiing trails and off-piste descents through Le Manchet Valley and beside the Calabourdane river. The restaurant is open during the day for lunch and tea, and can put on dinner in a yurt if booked in advance.

SELF-CONTAINED COLIVING SPACE TO OPEN IN MONTPELLIER Montpellier, Occitanie March 2025

Bikube Montpellier offers a new way of renting and living in this sunny southern French city. Private, fully-furnished apartments available to rent by the month, each with kitchenette, dining area, high-quality bed, shower room, clever storage space and a TV with Chromecast system. Living spaces and services are shared with neighbours, in an environment where everything has been designed to simplify daily life. Like a beehive, the residence is alive 24 hours a day thanks to its varied features: a restaurant, a coworking space, a magnificent garden at the heart of the block and a communal vegetable garden on the rooftop. There are electric car charging stations on the street outside, though all amenities are within easy reach on foot or by public transport.



ESCAPE TO THE MOUNTAINS

The mountains of France are midway through another sparkling winter season with a wealth of ski and non-ski activities, accessibility for all, increasingly greener resorts and varied accommodation. French ski school ESF also celebrates its 80th anniversary in 2025.

The new Vallon gondola is open in the Val d'Isère ski area, while in Courchevel, the 120-capacity Saulire cable car reopened in December 2024. Family-friendly Thollon-les-Mémises has joined the huge 'Magic Pass' uniting 80 ski resorts. The range of non-ski activities is ever growing: climb a frozen waterfall in Peisey-Vallandry; experience the bobsleigh track in La Plagne; go caving in the Dent de Crolles or take a chamois-spotting snowshoe hike in Les 2 Alpes; book a workshop in Val d'Arly using local medicinal plants; play trapper and stay in a forest tipi in La Clusaz; or enjoy farm visits in Le Grand Bornand.

More and more lifts and activities in the mountains cater for people with physical and intellectual disabilities, as well as those from disadvantaged social backgrounds. New accommodation for this season includes Villa Parcs' Résidence Méri-Bellecombe in Brides-les-Bains, the luxury Fleur des Alpes in Méribel and a cosy B&B in Villard-de-Lans. The 'Montagne Zéro Déchet Sauvage' charter was signed by France Montagnes in 2023, aiming to end waste in the French mountains by 2030, and 29 ski resorts have now been awarded the Flocon Vert label for their efforts in sustainable protection.

The group launched three NH Hotels in the first quarter of 2024: the 207-room NH Paris Gare de l'Est, the 103-room NH Opéra Paris Faubourg and the 90-room NH Paris Champs Elysées. The latter will be launched in 2025 as NH Collection following a renovation. The three hotels in Paris join Minor Hotels' current portfolio of six French properties located in Marseille, Lyon, Toulouse and Nice.

ALFRED HOTELS EXPANDING IN FRANCE WITH FOUR NEW ADDRESSES Across France 2025





BRITTANY FERRIES LAUNCHES TWO NEW HYBRID SHIPS Brittany & Normandy Spring 2025

Spring 2025 will soon see the arrival of two new hybrid-LNG ships into the Brittany Ferries fleet, part of the final and most ambitious fleet renewal programme in the company's history. Saint-Malo will operate Portsmouth to St-Malo route from February, while Guillaume Normandie is scheduled to commence sailing between Portsmouth to Caen in April. The new additions will be the first cross-Channel ferries to be hybrid-LNG - powered by both fuel and electricity - taking Brittany Ferries closer to a cleaner future. From dining and entertainment to cabin choices and décor, both ships have been specifically designed and built for the routes they will serve.







97%-RECYCLABLE TGV M TO ENTER SERVICE 2026

Fifth generation of high-speed train TGV M, ordered by SNCF, has been delayed but is due to enter service in 2026 on the Paris-Lyon line. The train has improved aerodynamics and can tailor onboard power use to its passenger count, whose maximum is 740 (up from the current 634). Compared to today's models, the TGV M is expected to consume 20% less energy and reduce carbon footprint by 37%. The new TGV livery and interiors feature a light palette of grey and white with superimposed rounded forms, evoking the comfort of the current TGV Inoui travel experience. The light colours should also cut down solar gain and reduce the amount of energy consumed by train airconditioning systems during periods of strong sunshine. Instead of using vinyls, the entire livery is painted, which is more durable and will reduce the time required for refurbishment work.

RYANAIR ANNOUNCES SEASONAL ROUTE FROM GATWICK TO CLERMONT-FERRAND Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes From end March 2025

Ryanair is expanding its network with an exciting new seasonal route between London Gatwick and the capital of France's volcano territory, <u>Clermont-Ferrand</u>. Offering direct flights between the two cities twice weekly (Wednesdays and Sundays) between March and October, this new service promises to open up one of France's most unique and scenic regions to UK travellers. The Auvergne Volcanoes Natural Park, west of Clermont, is Europe's largest volcanic complex and contains the UNESCO-listed Chaîne des Puys with 80 volcanoes alone: an exceptional environment for outdoor activities. From Clermont's train station, you can even reach some of the area's villages by bus within an hour.

BRITISH AIRWAYS TO CONNECT STANSTED WITH BERGERAC Nouvelle-Aquitaine From 28 June 2025

Bergerac Dordogne Périgord Airport is expanding its offerings with the announcement of a new route operated by British Airways. Operating every Saturday from 28 June, this service will directly connect London Stansted with Bergerac, making travel between Dordogne and the British capital more convenient than ever. Home to numerous picturesque bastide towns, vineyards and activities along its eponymous river, Dordogne is a muchloved destination for outdoor holidays, fine gastronomy, camping and château stays - with Bergerac as the gateway.
