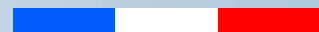

Ski lifts modernised for **an enhanced skiing experience**

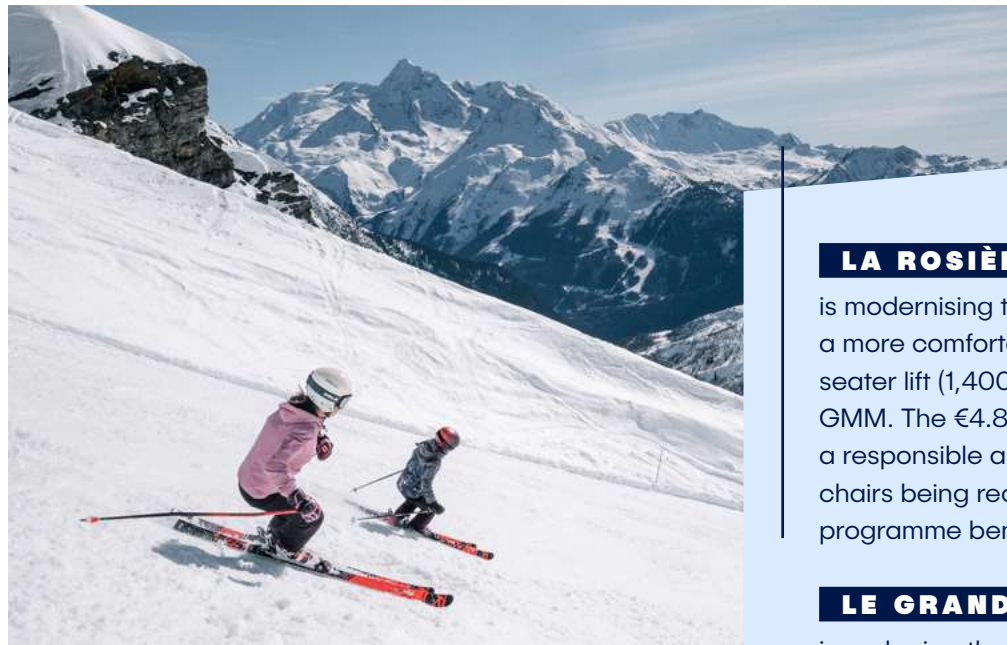
In 2025, French ski areas **invested €555 million**, equivalent to 32% of their turnover excluding tax — 9 points above the average of the past decade*.

This momentum continues into winter 2026–2027, with projects focused on comfort, accessibility and environmental transition. Modernised lifts, technological innovations, improved services and a reduced carbon footprint: resorts are investing to provide an increasingly seamless and sustainable experience.

Always evolving, mountain resorts are continuing to adapt to meet visitors' changing expectations. Modernised ski areas, new types of accommodation, immersive experiences, family activities, cultural events and major festivals: winter 2026–2027 promises a wealth of new developments, demonstrating destinations' ability to innovate while showcasing their natural heritage and commitment to a more sustainable mountain environment.

LA ROSIÈRE

is modernising the Petit-Bois chairlift with a more comfortable and efficient four-seater lift (1,400 skiers/hour) supplied by GMM. The €4.8 million investment follows a responsible approach, with the former chairs being recycled through a solidarity programme benefiting Mountain Riders.

LE GRAND TOURMALET

is replacing the Tournaboup chairlift with a modern gondola to improve access to La Laquette, a recently renovated mountain restaurant. Ten people per cabin, shorter travel time and comfort designed for both skiers and pedestrians.



LES CONTAMINES-MONTJOIE

is preparing to welcome a new Notre-Dame de la Gorge gondola. Fully accessible to people with reduced mobility, it will double transport capacity (10-seater cabins) and make access to the Tappes plateau smoother. The project also includes new services such as automatic ski lockers. Designed for year-round use, the infrastructure will also facilitate access to summer activities, particularly hiking and mountain biking.

PEISEY-VALLANDRY

is replacing the legendary Lonzagne village lift with a modern gondola offering 10 seats, scheduled to open in December 2026. After 43 years of service, the iconic red baskets closed for good in April 2026. The new Vallandry gondola will halve the ascent time, with capacity reaching 900 people per hour.

VAL CENIS

is undertaking two major projects to improve the ski-area experience while limiting environmental impact. The new detachable six-seater Grand Coin chairlift, largely made from reused components, replaces two former drag lifts and halves the project's greenhouse-gas emissions. Meanwhile, the Ramasse chairlift is being transformed into a gondola-chairlift combination by adding 18 cabins, making access to the Mont-Cenis plateau smoother and improving comfort for skiers and pedestrians. In both cases, Val Cenis is prioritising the reuse of existing infrastructure, illustrating its commitment to a circular economy and resource efficiency.



WHAT'S NEW

LE DÉVOLUY

is getting a new Jas gondola from manufacturer Leitner. It will replace the historic 1989 chairlift and halve the ascent time. More comfortable and accessible to skiers and pedestrians alike, the 10-seater gondola represents a €12.5 million investment and features a more efficient design, reducing energy and maintenance requirements.

VALMOREL

is redesigning access to the Grand Domaine with the new Combelouvière gondola. Replacing a four-seater chairlift and a drag lift, the 10-seater installation improves skier comfort and facilitates adaptive skiing. Its design, with 17 fewer pylons, offers better landscape integration. At the top, a new beginner area will allow novices to progress in a safe environment, while pedestrians will have easier access to the Crêtes de Doucy trail and the La Vache Orange mountain restaurant.

COURCHEVEL

is giving the La Tania gondola a complete makeover. Led by S3V, the strategic project concerns one of the main gateways to the ski area, with nearly 400,000 journeys per winter season. Located on the La Tania snow front, the lift is being fully renovated with 52 new panoramic eight-seater cabins, smoother boarding and modernised equipment. Increased actual capacity will also absorb the expected influx of visitors, notably linked to the delivery of the Barma development, La Tania's flagship new property programme.

WHAT'S ★ NEW

CHAMONIX -MONT-BLANC

is taking another major step in the rebirth of Les Grands Montets. Following the 2018 fire, the ski area will welcome the first section of its new gondola between Argentière and Lognan in December 2026, together with a beginners' area and a new food-and-beverage offer.

FONT-ROMEU

will open the new Carlit Express chairlift, providing access to the Carlit massif. Accessible to skiers and pedestrians, it makes it easier to explore the Bouillouses sector and its iconic panoramas. Visitors can more easily reach marked trails and enjoy snow-covered landscapes and the frozen Bouillouses lake, one of the most remarkable natural sites in the Catalan Pyrenees.

LA PLAGNE & VAL-D'ISÈRE

are among the pilot resorts testing Prinoth's first electric LTE-Motion snow groomers this winter. Quieter, with no fine-particle emissions, twice as economical to operate and requiring 20% less maintenance, this innovation marks a major step in decarbonising piste maintenance. Feedback from resort teams will help finalise development of this new generation of machines, which is set to transform snow-grooming practices over the long term.

In brief:

IN LES MONTAGNES DU JURA,

a covered conveyor belt will be inaugurated in the Les Rousses beginners' area, along with a rail luge (*designed and manufactured in France*) at the Terre Ronde alpine ski area in Plateau d'Hauteville.

MONCLAR

is creating a new green run, while **CHABANON** is installing a conveyor belt in its redesigned beginners' area on the snow front. It replaces the Cabane drag lift, commissioned in 1970. Its lighting will also enable night-skiing sessions.

In collaboration with artist Lucas Beaufort, several cabins of the Plattières gondola in **MÉRIBEL** are being decorated with original creations inspired by his graphic universe, blending mountains, surfing and snow-sports culture. A nod to the former customised gondola, turning the journey into an artistic experience in the heart of the 3 Valleys.

NEW EXPERIENCES

unusual, fun and sporting

LA TOUSSUIRE, SNOW KARTING BRINGS A NEW TWIST TO THE JOYS OF GLIDING

This activity, launched this summer in its grass version, will become a new winter après-ski attraction for young and old on the snow front. Engine-free and powered solely by gravity, the three-wheeled all-terrain kart is stable and easy to handle.

*Under-14s must be accompanied by an adult.
From age 10.*

Price: from €15 per session.

SAINT-SORLIN-D'ARVES SLALOMFLY

After launching in summer 2026, SlalomFly, Europe's longest zip line with bends, will be available this winter. Its 987-metre course features 360° and 720° turns, offering a high-adrenaline experience against the backdrop of the Aiguilles d'Arves, strengthening the resort's non-ski offer.

ALPE DU GRAND SERRE, THE "PISTEURS SUNSET APERITIF"

The "Pisteurs Sunset Aperitif" joins the winter programme after a successful test at the end of last season. This exclusive experience combines a chairlift ride, local-produce tasting at the summit of Serriou, conversations, games and quizzes about the resort and the ski-patroller profession, followed by a night descent by headlamp on freshly groomed slopes.

Price: €25 per person.

VAL THORENS

The Mountain Kart Xperience is a new activity offering a fun descent on snow in a three-wheeled kart specially designed for the mountains. With bends, controlled drifts and thrills, this activity is accessible to all and provides an original way to discover the slopes.



GRÉOLIÈRES-LES-NEIGES GRÉO'LUGE

In the Southern Alps, the 2-km Gréo'Luge rail coaster combines thrills with spectacular scenery. Opened this summer, it will experience its first season under snow, adding to the resort's non-ski activities.

Tarif: 1 run: €9 – 5 runs: €40.

COURCHEVEL SLED

Between COURCHEVEL 1850 and COURCHEVEL VILLAGE, the 2-km toboggan run, open until 7:15 p.m., is getting a new scenography with "Fera Lumia". Inspired by light and the forest, the production transforms the descent into an immersive experience where light effects, soundscape and carefully designed aesthetics accompany riders by day and night, creating a spectacular yet elegant experience.

The uphill lift is accessible to ski-pass and pedestrian-pass holders. From age 6.

Free for holders of a metal-brake sled; helmets are mandatory.



WHAT'S ★ NEW

THE PIOUS-PIOU NORDIC CLUB EXPANDS ACROSS THE SKI RESORTS

With lighter equipment and freer heels, Nordic skiing is particularly well suited to young children who want to become independent quickly.

In a safe gliding area, young cross-country skiers learn the basics through games and fun activities: gliding, turning, stopping in a snowplough and moving independently.

Against a backdrop of renewed interest in Nordic disciplines, the Piou-Piou Nordic Club is expanding across the ski resorts. Already present notably in esf schools in Alpe d'Huez, Autrans, Ax, Le Grand-Bornand, La Bresse, Les Saisies, Peisey-Nancroix and Villard-de-Lans, it welcomes two new destinations this winter: Chamrousse and Pralognan-la-Vanoise. This approach introduces Nordic activities from an early age and encourages families to enjoy them together.

LES ANGLES IS INAUGURATING THE CÉCILE HERNANDEZ BOARDERCROSS, A NEW FUN AND ACCESSIBLE GLIDING AREA

Named after its patron, champion and Paralympic medallist Cécile Hernandez, the course celebrates values of self-improvement, sharing and inclusion. This new feature enriches the ski area with a dynamic experience for thrill-seekers.



NEW SPACES contemplative



AU VAL D'ALLOS, THE CRAZY PARK OFFERS ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG AND OLD, INCLUDING ELECTRIC QUAD BIKES AND KARTING

Children aged 3 to 10 can discover their first driving sensations. This winter, drift karting is available from 1.30 m in height — combining technique, fun and precision for maximum style.

Price: €13 for 8 minutes / 4 tickets for €48.

ELECTRIC SKWHEEL® SKIING IS ARRIVING IN THE HAUTES-VOSGES

The activity is available from age 14 and supervised by esf instructors. It provides sensations similar to skiing on snow: leaning, carving and turning, but can be practised all year round. *"It's exhilarating; there are many similarities with skiing,"* said esf director Thierry Bastien after testing it.

Price: €35 for 1 hour 30 minutes.

The activity is also offered in other French mountain massifs, notably at Autrans, Saint-Pierre-de-Chartreuse, Alpe d'Huez, Chamonix and Saint-Lary.

VARIS is gaining two new panoramic areas with hammocks, sun loungers and interpretation tables. Accessible to skiers and pedestrians at the tops of the Chabrières gondola-chairlift and Vars Speed Master chairlift, they will be complemented by new picnic areas across the ski area. The resort is continuing to improve comfort and visitor experience while showcasing its landscapes, altitude and exceptional panoramas of the Hautes-Alpes.

VAL GENIS treetop walkway at Replat des Canons is accessible from the top of the Roches Blanches chairlift at 2,100 metres. This 126-metre panoramic walk will feature four themed areas dedicated to biodiversity, alpine landscapes, glaciers, and relaxation and contemplation. Interactive installations will help visitors of all ages better understand the challenges of protecting the mountains. A relaxation net will provide a suspended moment above the forest, while a spiral slide will offer an exciting way to finish the panoramic experience.

COURCHEVEL, is creating a new 300 m² panoramic terrace at the top of Chenus. Facing the majestic Saulire, this sun-drenched wooden relaxation area will offer skiers and walkers a privileged place to enjoy high-altitude scenery. Located near the new self-service picnic room opened in 2026, the terrace is part of a completely redesigned service hub.

OPENING IN EARLY DECEMBER 2026

Morgane hotel is being transformed and will reopen in early December 2026 as a five-star hotel after several months of renovation. Ideally located just steps from the Aiguille du Midi cable car, it will offer 54 rooms with balconies and mountain views, together with upgraded services.

► L'EXCELSIOR ****

OPENING DECEMBER 2026

Located in Les Tines, a few kilometres from **CHAMONIX-MONT-BLANC**, the four-star Excelsior is becoming Hotel Lizzie. Its new identity is a nod to Elizabeth Le Blond, "Lizzie", a pioneering Irish mountaineer and mountain photographer. The hotel will have 74 rooms and is scheduled to open in December 2026.

The new Daffy hotel is scheduled to open in December 2026. Set in a former barracks, this 3-star lifestyle property blends retro style, collective energy and an easy-going atmosphere. It offers 51 rooms and 33 apartments for different types of stays. Nearly 600 m² of shared spaces are dedicated to food and socialising, with a bar, terrace and relaxation areas. The slopes of **SERRE CHEVALIER** are eight minutes away on foot.

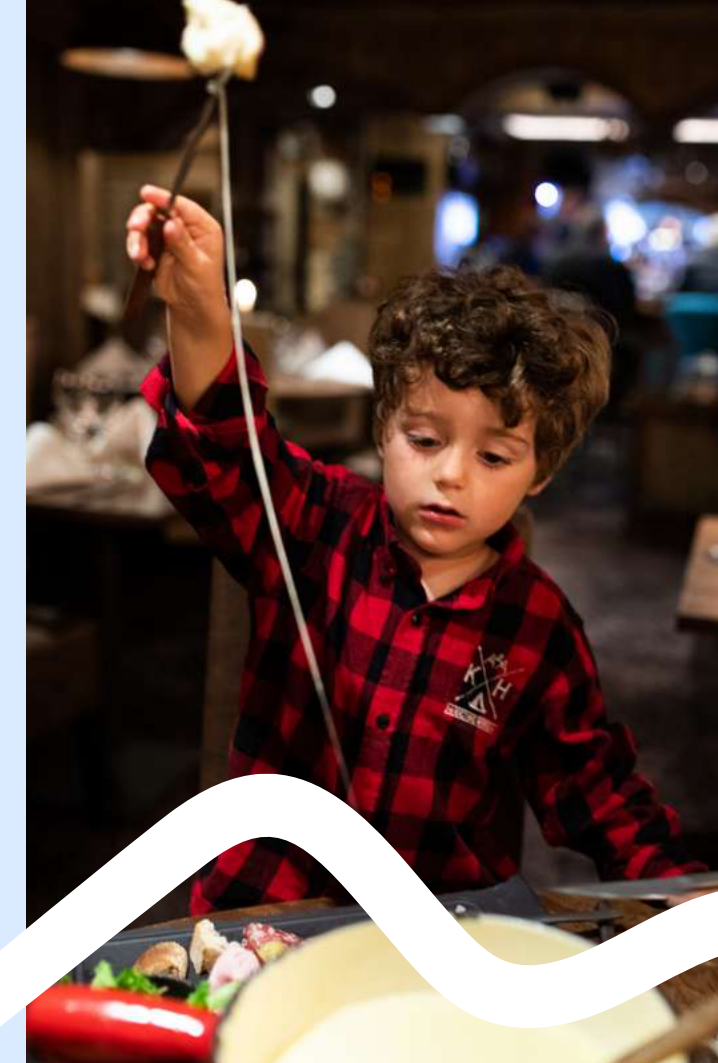

At the foot of the Hulotte run, **THE LE LAC BLEU RESIDENCE** will replace the former hotel of the same name. The new development will feature 29 luxury apartments, a spa, swimming pool, fitness room and restaurant, in a prime ski-in/ski-out location close to the Morel chairlift.

In Méribel-Mottaret, **LES CHALETs D'OUREA** will bring together 14 high-end apartments offering generous volumes and superb views of the surrounding peaks.

Finally, the 650+ m² **CHALET MONTCLAIR**, designed for up to 12 guests, features six suites, a 10-metre indoor pool, sauna, hammam, treatment room and spacious reception areas, embodying a new generation of luxury chalets in the heart of the 3 Valleys.



COURCHEVEL 8 NEW SPOTS TO TRY

Courchevel continues to expand its luxury accommodation offering with several major openings and renovations this winter.

HÔTEL SAINT ROCH joins the five-star category, while Chapitre Six takes over the former Hôtel **LES 3 VALLÉES** with the ambition of bringing it into the same category. The former Hôtel Pilatus, near the altiport, becomes **LILY OF THE VALLEY**, a new high-end address. **THE BÂRMA HÔTEL & SPA RESIDENCE** opens with a ski-in/ski-out luxury offer, while Alpine Resorts launches two new five-star hotels, **STEAMBOAT** and **SUNDANCE**. Finally, **LA SIVOLIÈRE** begins a new chapter with a major extension including a spa around a 25-metre pool, new apartments with hotel services and a new Italian gastronomic destination, **ZIA AT SIVOLIÈRE**.



SAINT-MAURICE- SUR-MOSELLE

► LE COCON

Opened last March in the Ballons des Hautes-Vosges, Le Cocon offers an unusual getaway. This geodesic dome opens onto the landscape, with panoramic mountain views and a skylight for admiring the starry sky from bed. A cocooning accommodation designed to slow down, recharge and enjoy the magic of Vosges nights.

WELLNESS ADDRESSES

VALMOREL

The resort is opening **KANOPE**, a new aquatic and wellness centre designed to extend the pleasures of the mountains after skiing. It includes a 120 m² indoor balneotherapy and leisure pool, a wellness area with hammam, balneotherapy pool, massage rooms and relaxation areas, as well as panoramic saunas and a fitness area.

VALLOIRE THE NEW GRAND SPA VALFORM,

completely redesigned as part of the renovation of the resort's leisure centre, is opening. This large wellness facility will feature four hammams with different atmospheres, two outdoor saunas, a Kneipp circuit designed to stimulate lower-limb circulation and aid recovery, relaxation areas and a modernised fitness room. A new place dedicated to relaxation and recovery, ideal after a day on the slopes.

MÉRIBEL

NOMAD is setting up on the Chaudanne snow front with a concept combining restaurant, après-ski and social hub. The venue will evolve throughout the day, from breakfast to après-ski with DJs and shows, before becoming a festive restaurant in the evening.

MÉRIBEL

THE CUCUCINA, 150-seat Italian restaurant, will replace the self-service restaurant at La Folie Douce and will serve chef Arnaud Nicolas's signature cacio e pepe and blue lobster linguine.

Starred chef and former Top Chef contestant Matthias Marc will soon open **MAISON DES CIMES** in Malbuisson in **LES MONTAGNES DU JURA**. This new ten-room property will combine a fine-dining restaurant, a bistro and an immersive experience in the heart of nature. Inspired by the forests of the Haut-Doubs and wood-fired cooking, this exceptional address will celebrate Jura terroir in a preserved setting between lake and fir trees.

At **LES MENUIRES**, **CHEZ PÉPÉ NICOLAS** is launching a new immersive experience in its high-altitude cheese-maturing cellar. The programme includes meetings with producers, an introduction to cheese-making and maturing know-how, and a tasting of local specialities in an intimate setting at the heart of a family farm passed down through four generations.

In December 2026, Clémence Vautrain and her partner Gauthier, both winegrowers in the Marne region, will open **LA DESCENTE**, a new wine and Champagne bar at **ARC 1800**. The couple will offer a selection of their own cuvées, as well as wines and Champagnes from growers they have met during their discoveries in the Champagne vineyards.



SPOTLIGHT

A SKI PASS SOLUTION

for the Aure and Louron valleys in the Hautes-Pyrénées is also being launched, with a new shared card covering **PIAU-ENGALY**, **VAL LOURON**, **PEYRAGUDES** and **SAINT-LARY**. Designed for regular skiers and ski-safari enthusiasts, the €25 card provides preferential rates throughout the season across the four ski areas, giving access to 250 km of slopes in the heart of the Aure and Louron valleys. A simple, affordable way to vary your skiing experience throughout the winter.

TIGNES

LE SEYJOUN RESIDENCE

("season" in local dialect) will provide 70 homes specifically for seasonal workers at TIGNES. More than simple accommodation with services, it embodies a new vision of mountain housing: sustainable, responsible and inclusive. The project represents €17 million in investment shared by the municipality of Tignes and Tignes Développement. Delivery and inauguration are scheduled for mid-November 2026.



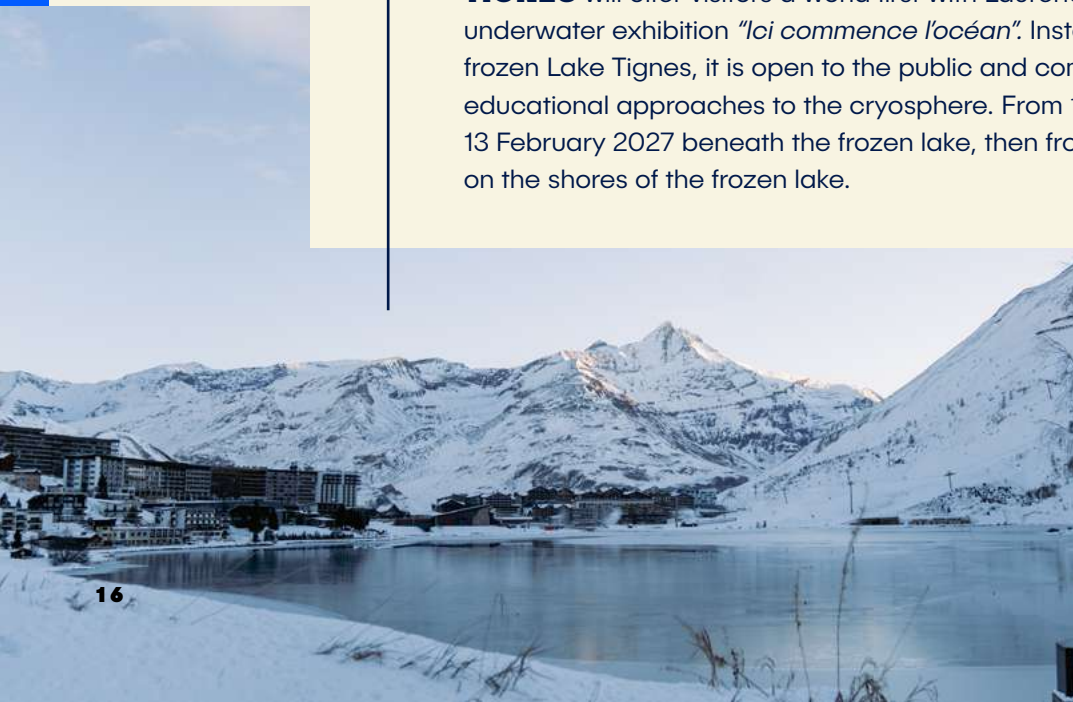
CULTURE & HERITAGE

take centre stage this winter

CHAMROUSSE will open a new 1968 Olympic Games Heritage Space dedicated to the legacy of the Grenoble Olympics, with an immersive exhibition combining archives, objects and educational activities for school groups, families and sports enthusiasts. The resort will also strengthen its Olympic identity with the installation of Olympic rings at Chamrousse 1650. The museum will be housed in the former meteorological building at the resort's summit.

A new art trail has been created at the Espace Beldina at **LES 7 LAUX** in Belledonne massifs and will experience its first winter. Three works are installed along the trail, making art accessible in a setting that encourages contemplation.

TIGNES will offer visitors a world first with Laurence Chilin and Alban Michon's underwater exhibition "Ici commence l'océan". Installed beneath and beside the frozen Lake Tignes, it is open to the public and combines artistic, scientific and educational approaches to the cryosphere. From 15 December 2026 to 13 February 2027 beneath the frozen lake, then from 13 February to 30 April 2027 on the shores of the frozen lake.



NEW WINTER EVENTS

for 2026-27

From major sporting events to public entertainment, resorts are multiplying opportunities to experience the mountains in new ways.

► From 2 to 4 April 2027

SERRE CHEVALIER will host the first edition of the Outdoormix Winter Festival. For three days, the resort will vibrate to the rhythm of snow sports, demonstrations, DJ sets and concerts, in a festive format combining action sports, music and conviviality in the mountains.

► From 18 to 22 January 2027

TIGNES will host two Ski & Snowboard Big Air World Cups (new) as part of the Mountain Shaker festival (14-22 January).

► From 7 to 19 March 2027

TIGNES For the first time, the resort will also host the World Para Alpine Skiing Championships from 7 to 19 March 2027.

Its 18th edition will take place from 19 to 21 March 2027 in aid of various causes benefiting children.**

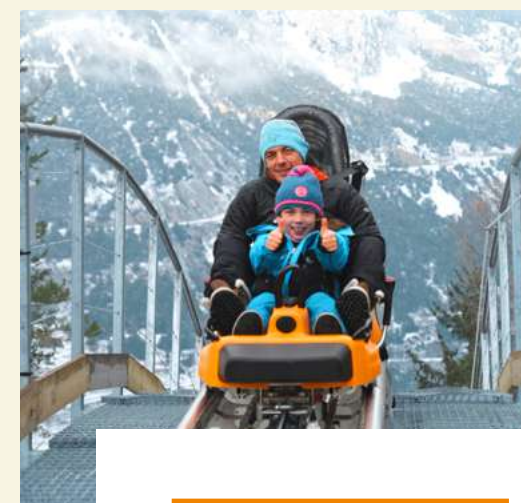

Every week during school holidays, ski patrollers and their avalanche dog visit the Piou-Piou garden (ages 3–5), supervised by esf. Through fun workshops, children learn good habits on the slopes, trail markings and essential safety rules, becoming true mountain-safety ambassadors for their families.



NEWLY AWARDED THE FAMILLE PLUS LABEL, LA NORMA

Newly awarded the Famille Plus label, La Norma offers a range of activities allowing families to experience the mountains differently. Between discovery, thrills and shared moments, children and adults can meet farm animals at the educational farm, try a **winter via ferrata** accessible from age 10, compete in a **night snow-karting** session with esf, or ride the **rail luge**.

WHAT'S NEW



At the heart of the Alpes Azur Mercantour International Dark Sky Reserve, DOME — officially inaugurated this summer — offers scientific activities, exhibitions and stargazing year-round. This new departmental centre for environmental awareness and observation brings together a planetarium, Mercantour National Park House, media library and cinema, inviting visitors to discover the mountains differently this winter. Specially designed for children, planetarium sessions and nature workshops will be offered.



LES ORRES IS OFFERING THE BABY PASS (ages 3–4) this winter.

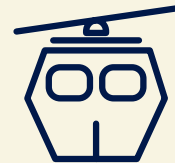


CHAMROUSSE CONTINUES TO EXPAND ITS FAMILY OFFER WITH SEVERAL NEW FEATURES.

La Montagne de Téo is growing with new fun areas on the Éterlou run and at Initiatic Park, while **La Croisette (1750)** is becoming a true multi-leisure hub with a new tubing area, Big Air Bag, play and relaxation areas, and discovery trails. Finally, the **Lauze sector** is gaining a new beginners' area with a double covered conveyor belt and a larger learning zone, providing families and young skiers with even more comfortable learning conditions.

SAINT-LARY IS OPENING ITS "LITTLE VALLEY" TREETOP ADVENTURE PARK IN WINTER.
